

# Gmail: How to update hostname in Gmail.

If you are using Gmail to manage your emails, you can update your hostname to use mail.elite.uk as the incoming server and smtp.relay.elite.net.uk as the outgoing server. Here are the steps to follow:

1. Open Gmail and click on the Gear icon located at the top right corner of the page.
2. From the drop-down menu, select "Settings".
3. Click on the "Accounts and Import" tab.
4. Under the "Check mail from other accounts" section, click on "Add a mail account".
5. Enter your email address and click "Next".
6. Select "Import emails from my other account (POP3)" and click "Next".
7. In the "Username" field, enter your full email address.
8. In the "Password" field, enter your email password.
9. In the "POP Server" field, enter "mail.elite.uk".
10. In the "Port" field, enter "995".
11. Select "Always use a secure connection (SSL) when retrieving mail".
12. Click "Add Account".

Once your incoming server details have been updated, you will need to update your outgoing server details as well. Here's how:

1. Under the "Send mail as" section, click on "Add another email address".
2. Enter your name and email address.
3. In the "SMTP Server" field, enter "smtp.relay.elite.net.uk".
4. In the "Port" field, enter "465".
5. Select "Secured connection using SSL".
6. Click "Add Account".

You have now successfully updated your hostname on Gmail using mail.elite.uk as the incoming server and smtp.relay.elite.net.uk as the outgoing server.
